How to Submit Entries

The website **www.life-works.ie** will host all the details of how students can submit entries. While these are straightforward, we encourage teachers to familiarise themselves with them (especially for the new Art Poster competition) in case the students may need assistance.

Prizes

Both the Life Advocate Essay and Poster winners each receive a stylish trophy and certificate, together with 1st prize €300/£260 and a visit to Leinster House with your class.

School Award

We are offering a trophy and prize of €120/£100 to the school that submits the most entries to our competition (minimum three entries, across either essays, art posters or both).

Essay Rules:

We are looking for structured, well-composed essays reflecting the general theme above. Essays should be 600-750 words. We encourage research (but if statistics or quotations are used in the essay, they must be referenced).

Art Poster

We are looking for 2D posters, with any or all of the following elements: imagery, lettering, montage, etc.

Artwork must be an original work by the participant. No collaborative work, photocopies or use of copyrighted material is permitted. Art Posters will viewed by the judges as scanned images. Each poster is evaluated on originality, adherence to theme, artistic ability and overall effect.
